Myanmar Insight Visit 5 Days

Day 1 Hong Kong - Yangon

Depart Hong Kong by TG 629 at 1410 hrs, arrival Bangkok at 1550 hrs, connect TG 305 at 1755 hrs, Arrive at Yangon at 1840 hrs. Meet and assist on arrival transfer to Hotel for overnight stay.

Day 2 Yangon [B'fast/ lunch / Local restaurant (Myanmar)

After breakfast full day sightseeing in Yangon .

Yangon lies in the fertile delta of southern Myanmar, on the wide Yangon River. The city is filled with tree-shaded boulevards, while shimmering stupas float above the treetops. The city became the capital only in 1885, when the British completed the conquest of Upper Myanmar and Mandalay's brief period as capital of the last Burmese Kingdom ended.

Start the day at the SULE PAGODA, a gleaming octagonal pagoda that stands squarely at the centerpoint of the city. Afterwards, visit the NATIONAL MUSEUM to gain an insight into Myanmar. See the eight meter high Sihasana Lion Throne, used by the last Burmese king, and other fascinating artifacts from Burmese history and culture. Enjoy a break at BOGYOKE (SCOTT) MARKET, a pleasant covered market containing crafts from all corners of Myanmar, gems, fabrics and more. (The market is closed on Mondays and public holidays.

In the afternoon, visit some of the more well known pagodas, including BOTATAUNG PAGODA, named after the 1000 military leaders who escorted relics of the Buddha from India over 2000 years ago, and NGADATKYI PAYA, with a giant seated Buddha image. Finally, continue to the SHWEDAGON PAGODA, the highlight of any visit to Yangon. Towering over the city, this pagoda is the most sacred spot in the country, built to house eight hair relics of the Buddha. The Shwedagon and surrounding shrines are at their most beautiful during the sunset hour, as the golden Stupa reflects the changing colors of twilight. Overnight in Yangon.

Day 3 Yangon – Bagan [B'fast / Lunch local restaurant / Dinner Nanda restaurant



After breakfast at hotel, early morning flight to Bagan to discover its glorious past and histories. Meet & assist on arrival transfer to Hotel for check in. There after full day sightseeing of Bagan city.

Bagan is a spectacular plain stretching away from the Ayeyarwaddy River, dotted with thousands of 800-year old temple ruins. Although human habitation at Bagan dates back almost to the beginning of the Christian era, Bagan only entered its golden period with the conquest of Thaton in 1057AD.

SHWEZIGON PAYA: King Anawrahta started the construction of the Schwezigon Pagoda to enshrine some relicts of Buddha. The construction was finished by his successor, King Kyansittha between 1086 And 1090. Originally the Shwezigon Pagoda marked the northern end of the city of Bagan. The stupa's graceful bell shape became a prototype for virtually all later stupas over Myanmar. **GUBYAUKHYI TEMPLE** at Wetkyi-Inn: This Temple was built in the early 13th Century and repaired in 1468. The great colorful painting about the previous life of Buddha and the distinguished architecture make this temple an interesting site for a visit. This temple is not to be confounded with the Gubyaukgyi Temple in Myinkabe.

ANANDA PAHTO: one of the finest, largest, best preserved and most revered of the Bagan temples. Thought to have been built around 1105 by King Kyanzittha, this perfectly proportioned temple heralds the stylistic end of the Early Bagan period and the beginning of the Middle period. **GUBYAUKGYI TEMPLE** at Myinkaba: Built in 1113 by Kyanzittha son Rajakumar, this temple is famous for its well-preserved Stuccos from the 12th century on the outside walls. The magnificent paintings date from the original construction of the temple and are considered to be the oldest original paintings in Bagan

MANUHA TEMPLE: The Manuha Temple was built in 1059 by King Manuha, the King of Thaton, who was brought captive to Bagan by King Anawrahta. It enshrines the unusual combination of 3 seated and one reclining image Buddha. It is said that this temple was built by Manuha to express his displeasure about his captivity in Bagan

SHWESANDAW PAYA: In 1057 King Anawrahta built this Pagoda following his conquest of Thaton. This is the first monument in Bagan, which features stairways leading up from the square bottom terraces to the round base of the Stupa. This Pagoda is ideal to watch Bagan's magnificent sunsets.

LACQUERWARE WORKSHOP: the villages around Bagan are known for producing the finest lacquerware in Myanmar. Stop by one of the workshops and learn about the painstaking process of lacquerware making and decoration. Overnight stay at Hotel

Day 4 Bagan – Yangon (Breakfast/ Lunch /Dinner at Local Restaurant)

After breakfast, Excursion to Mount Popa - **MOUNT POPA:** A curiously cylindrical hill rising sharply from the surrounding plain, Mount Popa is considered to be the home of Myanmar's most important nats (spirits). Visitors ascend up a winding covered staircase encircling the mountain, observed by the curious monkeys that populate the area. At the top is a monastery and temple complex, with shrines to the 37 nats and a spectacular view over the region.

Transfer - Flight from Bagan to Yangon., meet on arrival transfer to Hotel for overnight stay.

Day 5 Yangon – Hong Kong

Morning transfer to airport for flight to Bangkok by TG 304 at 0950 hrs, arrival at 1130 hrs. connect TG 630 at 1520 hrs , arrival Hong Kong 1905 hrs.

Yangon - Mini break Visit

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Day 2 Yangon – Kyaikhtiyo

Pick-up at hotel in Yangon and drive to Bago (84 km - 1½ hours). En route, visit the Allied War Graves cemetery near Htauk Kyan, a tree shrine dedicated to legendary animist spirits known as "Nats", a handicraft village that produces woven bamboo wares. In Bago sightseeing includes the 55-meter-long reclining Shwethalyaung Buddha image and Shwemawdaw Pagoda, which is over a thousand years old. Its spire is even taller than that of Yangon's Shwedagon Pagoda

After lunch, continue to Kin Pun "base camp" (110 km - 3½ hours) and onward to Kyaikhtiyo (the "Golden Rock"), a huge boulder completely covered by gold leaves and delicately balanced on the edge of a cliff. From Kin Pun, a steep and rough 11-km dirt road leads to the upper staging point, a journey made in open trucks, which can be very crowded. In the afternoon, take a local truck up a bumpy track about half way up the mountain. (Private trucks are available at extra costs – please ask your guide to arrange). From the "upper area", travelers must walk the final stage (about 4 kilometers) up steep paths, which ascend some 500 meters to the Golden Rock. As an easier alternative to walking, visitors can be carried in sedan chairs by four porters (on pax own account), On arrival, watch the beauty of a sunset at this important pilgrimage site. Overnight stay



Day 3 Kyaikhtiyo – Thaton – Hpa-an – Mawlamyine

Breakfast at hotel. Departure from Kyaikhtiyo for Mawlamyine (Moulmein) (115 km - 6 hours). En route, stop in Thaton, former capital of the Mon Kingdom. Lunch is served at a simple local restaurant en route. Between Thaton and Hpa-An stop for a visit at the Bayintnyi Cave. Continue, passing the bridge across the Thanlwin River, to Hpa-an, the capital of Kayin State. Brief stop in Hpa-an before proceeding on the last stretch (about 1 hour) to Mawlamyine. Arrival in Mawlamyine, the capital of Mon State, late in the afternoon. Dinner at hotel and overnight Attran Hotel in Mawlamyine (Superior room). Overnight stay.

Day 4 Mawlamyine - Yangon

Breakfast at hotel. Full day of sightseeing in and around Mawlamyine. Visit the local Zegyi market in the morning before leaving Mawlamyine for a visit to the small town of Mudon (20 km - 1 hour). The area between Mawlamyine and Mudon is very fertile and well known for its rubber

plantations and the numerous seasonal fruits grown here. A newly built huge reclining Buddha can be seen en route. Stop at Kyauktalone, a Buddhist Stupa and a Hindu temple facing each other. Return to Mawlamyine for

lunch at a local restaurant. After lunch, visit the Mon State National Museum, where traditional music instruments, clothes and old Mon language scripts are displayed. Sightseeing continues with the Mahamuni Pagoda, Kyaikthanlan

Pagoda (known as the Kipling Pagoda) and Seindon Mibaya Kyaung, where King Mindon's wife sought refuge. These religious buildings are all situated on a mountain range from where beautiful sunsets can be observed. Late on return to Yangon for overnight stay.
